IN CASE YOU MISSED IT

Hirayama Seminar: At the end of October, the dojo was honored to host Sensei Yuko Hirayama for our first-ever camp featuring a JKA Headquarters instructor. We're especially grateful for the younger NorCal students who attended the Friday general training! We hope that you come away with a positive experience and feel inspired to continue on your karate journey.

We kicked off on Saturday morning with an open mat, where all participants had the opportunity to



train with current and former members of the United States National Team in both kumite and kata. This boosted morale and brought campgoers a renewed sense of unity that carried

through into Hirayama Sensei's classes later that day in the heart of San Francisco.







Over the course of the seminar, Hirayama Sensei led five information-packed sessions in San Francisco's Japantown. A general focus of kata instruction was on correct execution, including proper posture, stances, hip position, eye direction, and course of techniques. Ideas stressed in kihon and kumite included the incorporation of relaxation before and after each waza - "0 - 10 - 0," and using floor connection (tame) to maximize both power and distance. Sensei Hirayama also provided insight into different levels of training by explaining progressions for kihon kumite between the color belt, brown belt, and black belt levels. By framing the drills in such an accessible way, Sensei provided participants of all skill levels a way to apply her lessons in their daily practice.

In addition to her excellent teaching and humility, Hirayama Sensei's philosophies of life-long learning and "seizing the moment" deeply resonated with participants. Not only did these ideas strengthen their technique and connection to karate-do, but they also

had greater implications for their everyday lives. We would like to express our sincere gratitude to Hirayama Sensei for their exceptional instruction and dedication, as well as to the organizers, volunteers, and supporting dojos who made this camp possible through their tireless efforts and commitments. We're looking forward to seeing how this event evolves and grows over the next several years.
